Remember, we are hosting our Online Auction. As a charter school, MRA currently receives 83% funding for each student, or 17% less than our district. That means, if the district receives \$7500.00/student in a given year, then MRA will get 83% of that amount, or \$6225.00/student. When making our annual budget, we calculate our dollars per student and we add in our fundraising. The majority of the fundraising we do is targeted toward specific departments such as technology, playground and garden. The auction is our largest money producer and the one fundraiser that mostly supports our general fund, helping to fill in that 17% gap. We budget close to \$30,000.00 raised from the auction in our budget. Without the auction this year, we are therefore planning on a \$30,000.00 deficit. We are, however, hoping to fill in some of that gap with our Online Auction. You can go online yourself and bid on items or give a tax deductible donation, and you can share the link with family and friends. Remember, MRA is a 501c3 non-profit organization.

Old Information

Free/Reduced Lunch Recipients:

Oregon is the recipient of a grant to provide funds to children experiencing food insecurity during this Pandemic. The Oregon Department of Education Child Nutrition Programs is supporting The Pandemic Electronic Benefits Transfer (P-EBT) program by collecting data from schools. If your child is eligible, you will be contacted shortly by DHS. Instructions will be included to activate or refuse benefits.

MRA Chromebooks

If you have checked out an MRA chromebook for Distance Learning, please plan to return it to MRA either on June 5th, or the next week by June 10th. Remember, per your signed agreement:

Grades and Report Cards—Update:

As you may know already, ODE is now requiring schools K-12 to provide students with report cards. After many conversations with ODE, we will be giving students a Pass or an Incomplete in their classes based on evidence produced and evidence seen by teachers. Students in grades K-4 will received a Pass or Incomplete in core subjects only, not in specials. Student in grades 5-8 will received a Pass or Incomplete in all subjects. The report cards will look slightly different, with short narratives only because we cannot grade skills at this time. An incomplete does not require the student repeat any classes or any coursework, it merely means that the teacher did not have enough evidence to give the student a pass.
